

# Note from the Maestro

For its 39th consecutive season, VoxAmaDeus continues its tradition of extraordinary live performances that bring to life the glorious music of the Renaissance, Baroque, and Classical eras. Our concerts feature a fantastic selection of works—by old and new masters—for our three performing groups. And in January, **Winter Soirée** offers an intimate musical encounter with brilliant British piano virtuoso Peter Donohoe.

Camerata Ama Deus debuts with our annual celebrations of two perennially favorite Baroque composers—Bach in September (Bach Fest) and Vivaldi in November (Vivaldissimo), which will include the complete Four Seasons, in honor of their 300th anniversary! Then we have Brilliant Baroque in March and ABC in April, each an exciting mix of famous as well as lesser-known Baroque composers—each a delightful concert sure to brighten your spring. Camerata concerts all include Maestro's engaging and informative "live notes."

**Vox Renaissance Consort** performs two enchanting concert series that will transport you back in time to the glory of Old Europe, with lush costumes and period instruments, and heavenly music of European masters, as well as traditional carols. In addition to the annual December **Renaissance Noëls** is another uplifting concert series, **Renaissance Candlemas** in February, which features beautiful sacred motets in honor of this midwinter Christian feast.

Ama Deus Ensemble presents five superb concerts, beginning at the Kimmel Center in October with Mozart Coronation Mass + Symphony 40 (also featuring the Piano Concerto No. 20), which explores Mozart's genius in various genres, all of which he mastered. In December, four performances of our traditional Handel Messiah on Baroque instruments, this year once again including the magnificent Cathedral of Ss. Peter and Paul. In January, we return to the Kimmel Center, venturing in a new direction with Beethoven Emperor, an all-Beethoven program featuring renowned British pianist Peter Donohoe, who will perform two of the composer's virtuosic piano concertos. On Good Friday, a program of two sublime works, Mozart Requiem & Rossini Stabat Mater, to honor this sacred day. And for our grand finale in June, a glorious ending to an amazing season, we offer Bach Magnificat & Concerti, featuring instrumental gems as well as one of his most beloved major choral works.

Bach wrote relatively few orchestral works, but each is a masterpiece. Our annual Bach Fest concert that opens each season is a celebration of these marvels of Bach's musical genius. The program will feature two of his festive dance suites, written for the wealthy court at Cöthen: the delightful Orchestral Suite No. 2, with a virtuosic part for the flute soloist; and the second movement from the Suite No. 3, popularly known as "Air on the G String." In addition are solo works for flute and violin, and the exquisite "Bach Double," his only concerto for two violins. The evening's finale is the Piano Concerto in A Major, which Maestro Radu will perform on St. Katharine's magnificent Bösendorfer Grand Piano while conducting from the keyboard. Complementing the program will be Maestro's customary "live notes." Join us for a fabulous start to our Season 39!



This all-Mozart program is a joyous feast of Mozart masterpieces. The title work is the celebratory *Coronation Mass*, so named because it became the preferred music for imperial coronations, including two Habsburg emperors. The Symphony No. 40 in g minor is one of his most celebrated and widely performed works and one of a trio of symphonies (all written within three months in 1788), considered the pinnacle of his symphonic works. Rounding out this fabulous program is the rapturous motet *Exsultate*, *jubilate* for soprano and the breathtaking Piano Concerto No. 20, in which Maestro Radu will perform as soloist while conducting from the keyboard (as did Mozart).



At this year's January concert, we present a program of glorious music by Beethoven, in which the brilliant British piano virtuoso Peter Donohoe will perform two of Beethoven's monumental piano concertos: the No. 4, which astonished and delighted audiences with its bold innovations; and the majestic No. 5, named "The Emperor" (though not by the composer), famed for its originality and beauty. Among many other innovations by this composer is the creation of a new genre, that of orchestral overture as a standalone concert piece, and not simply as introduction to a stage or vocal work. This program will include three of the most beloved of the eleven overtures he composed: the Egmont, the Leonore No. 1, and the Coriolan.

Beyond Bach and Vivaldi, many other European composers contributed to the brilliance of the Baroque era, and this concert presents five of them—from Germany, Italy, and England. In addition to Vivaldi, recently featured composers Telemann and Avison are joined by composers that are rarely heard, including Giuseppe Brescianello, Alessandro Marcello and Giovanni Pergolesi, in sparkling gems for solo recorder, flute, violin and trumpet, and a thrilling double concerto for flute and recorder by Telemann.
